We offer the region's most comprehensive undergraduate public law program, staffed by three nationally recognized scholars (two of whom also hold law degrees) who specialize in public law topics and who have faculty affiliations with NIU College of Law. They offer a wide range of law-related courses that utilize diverse instructional methods such as seminar approaches, the traditional lecture format, the Socratic "case method" and online instruction.

Exceptional students have the opportunity to participate in our Accelerated Law Degree program, which offers the opportunity to earn both a bachelor's degree in Political Science and a J.D. degree in only six years, rather than seven.
