NOTES:

- Elective courses are typically 3 credits each
- 400-level electives have a pre-req (except 485 and 489)
- Register early for 305 and labs (they fill)
- Psyc main office maintains waiting lists for 305 and labs
- Lab courses are best spread across different semesters
- Overall PSYC GPA must be ≥ 2.0 to graduate
- Passing grade meets requirement except in STAT
- « PSYC 485 or 489 (or both) are recommended!
- Honors courses (unlisted) also meet elective reqs
